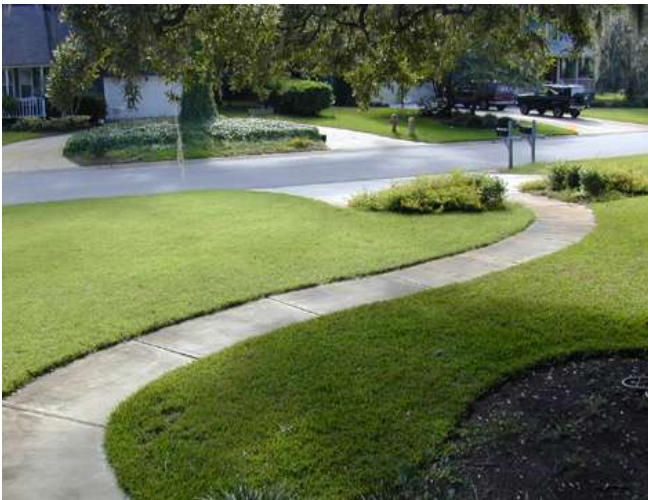


LAKE UTILITY SERVICES INC. Water Allocation Flyer



Water is one of Florida’s most precious resources. As the supply of groundwater becomes more scarce, the unit cost of providing water will undoubtedly increase. Water conservation is an important part of life in Florida and Lake Utility Services is encouraging support of the Water Management District’s irrigation policies. Conservation is not only environmentally important; it will very likely reduce your monthly water bill. Lake Utilities Consumptive Use Permit (CUP) allows an irrigation rate of 38.2 in/yr. In order to determine a maximum allocation for the CUP, the District took into account the size of the lot and your community’s soil types. Your individual maximum share of irrigation water can be calculated based on your lot size. A table is provided below that illustrates typical lot sizes in and out of your community.

Note: Any individual who can demonstrate legitimate need to irrigate more than the times below can apply for a Standard General Permit at www.floridaswater.com .Any customer approved for a Standard General Permit shall notify the Utility.

The current mandatory watering restrictions are detailed below:

Time of year	Homes with odd numbered or no addresses	Homes with even numbered addresses	Nonresidential properties
Daylight Savings	Wednesday/Saturday	Thursday/Sunday	Tuesday/Friday
Standard Time	Saturday	Sunday	Tuesday

- Daylight saving time:
Second Sunday in March until the first Sunday in November
- Eastern Standard Time:
First Sunday in November until the second Sunday in March
- An odd numbered address is one that ends in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9.
- An even numbered address is one that ends in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8.
- Water only when needed and not between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Water for no more than one hour per zone.
- Restrictions apply to private wells and pumps, ground or surface water and water from public and private utilities.
